cutting ceremony. We rocked our State
testing and now it's on to end of year fun!
Many classes are planning events, so be

As we wrap up the school year, our kindergarteners are diving into their final ELA lessons, mastering tricky words with determination. In math, we're reviewing challenging topics and exploring new concepts to prepare for the year ahead. Amidst testing, we eagerly anticipate our Kindergarten Graduation—please RSVP to secure your seats for this milestone event! First grade finished their unit on telling time and have begun measurement. We completed the unit about the beginning of America and are now learning about the early American explorers. We learned how to write a complete informational paragraph. We have one reader to go. We are continuing to work in our garden plot, and it is our job to collect the chicken eggs, clean them, and keep the water and food full.

Second grade has been enjoying the wonderful May weather and taken to the outdoors to do a lot of learning, whether that be planting and taking care of our garden or just taking the math lesson to the pavilion to measure dandelions. We've also been advancing our social skills by learning American Sign Language.

Third Grade has had an exciting month! We entered the Ice Cream Challenge that is sponsored by New York Agriculture in the Classroom. Our final recipe and marketing scheme has been submitted and we wait for the results of the judges. As part of our research for the Challenge, we tried several recipes, surveyed school peers of their favorite ice cream toppings, and visited Trinity Valley Farm on May 24. Our final recipe uses Trinity Valley's "Homogenized, Gently Pasteurized and Protein Rich" variety of whole milk as well as a few other ingredients. Keeping our fingers crossed! We have also been busy in the garden planting perennials and annuals.

4th grade will finish our study of Treasure Island next week! Students have enjoyed meeting all of the characters - and we have had great class discussions about Jim Hawkins (our narrator). The version we are reading is vastly abridged (9 chapters) and edited for content - but the "thrill" of the pirate danger has remained intact! We will be watching Treasure Planet (a Disney PG adaptation of Treasure Island) as a class on Monday, May 31st. Students are invited to "dress like a pirate" that day - and a permission slip was sent home regarding temporary tattoos as well as the movie viewing. I will be providing "Pirate Booty" popcorn and chocolate gold coins - as well as pirate hats, mustaches, and eye patches. As for Agriculture - we have many updates! Our peas and cucumbers are growing - and we just started our 3sisters. This week and next, we are planting sunflowers - which should bloom for us as school is starting in the fall! Our small animal barn is now occupied by two female goats (Peanut Butter and Cookie Dough) and a small flock of chickens. 4th grade did some extra weeding in the garden to assist Ms. Jamie in prepping other garden beds. Our painted rocks look GREAT in our garden space.

It has been a very busy month in 5/6! We worked extremely hard on the science fair, which was an amazing success! Thank you to all who came to support our kiddos, they did an amazing job!! I am so proud of them!! We have been studying The Crusades in History and will be starting a new novel study in ELA this coming month. We have a field trip to the Philips Free Library coming up in June; watch for details to come home. 6th grade will have their moving up ceremony and their end of elementary school field trip, with details coming soon as well. We only have a month of school left; we are looking forward to Summer!

In the month of May, we grew by 9 garden beds, 100's of feet of high tunnel drip tape, 2 goats, 11 chickens, and 21 incubating chicken eggs. Students in 1st and 3rd grade are caring for the animals and harvesting eggs for the cafeteria. All classes have been active in their garden beds and working hard to move materials around where needed. The eggs incubating in 5/6th grade will be hatching to join our flock during the first week of June.

Plant and animal care continues through the summer in our active Rural Life Lab. Stay tuned for announcements about a weekly gardening club, animal care opportunities, and more!
